Local hideaways are memorable places to celebrate your first night together

IF YOU'RE LIKE most brides-to-be, you've dreamed about your wedding night since you were 12. But it's safe to say that most elements of that preteen vision have faded since then, chief among them Johnny Depp or—admit it—Seann William Scott in the role of your new hubby. And because the idea of spending that first night in a heart-shaped bed with red satin sheets probably doesn't hold the appeal it used to either, here are some intriguingly modern—and undeniably sexy—retreats to consider for your first night as husband and wife.

Longing for retro glamour? There's no need to travel through time or space; just head to the **Hotel deLuxe**, formerly the Malory Hotel, whose mood and décor evoke Hollywood's golden age. The hotel also boasts the newly restored Driftwood Room, the perfect place for a nightcap before you're carried up to the Marlene Dietrich Suite, with its parlor area and an eight-foot circular (not heart-shaped) bed. If a short drive sounds like a romantic prelude to a more romantic evening, consider heading to heart of hip, historic downtown Astoria, where the **Hotel Elliott** offers penthouse suites overlooking the Columbia River. The recently—and gorgeously—restored five-story hotel features a rooftop garden with breathtaking views and both wine and cigar bars. Most importantly, the suites have decadent, king-size, pillow-top beds outfitted with 400-thread-count Egyptian cotton sheets; spa tubs big enough for two; heated stone floors in each bathroom; and a private wet bar. And don't plan on leaving your room early the next day, as you'll receive a Good Morning Basket that includes a newspaper, juice, fresh pastries and biscotti from local bakeries.
