### Foster & Dobbs

### Ace Hotel Portland

Originally constructed in 1912, Ace Hotel Portland spans an entire city block bordering the Pearl District. Many historic details—including its deep cast-iron, roll-top baths and voluminous sinks, ceiling moldings, mosaic-tiled flooring and the lobby's polished-wood paneling—have been preserved for an added warmth not typically seen in the minimalist aesthetic. ### Hotel deLuxe

Influenced by Hollywood glamour during film's Golden Age, the Hotel deLuxe is at once the height of cosmopolitan elegance while remaining unpretentious. Nearly 400 photographs from classic films of the 1930s to 1950s adorn the walls of each corridor and all 130 rooms. Each floor bears a distinct theme, from "The Maestro" (Hitchcock) to "The Rebels" (Orson Welles, Eliz Kazan, et al) to "The Masters" (Frank Capra and crew). Portland's first hotel to offer full HDTV capabilities, the technological treats further extend to multi-room MP3 docking stations, an MP3 menu and high-speed wireless Internet. Guests can also take a trip back to a less-frenzied time, languishing in luxury

### Cielo Home

Located in a 19th-century stable nestled in the heart of Portland's Pearl District, Cielo Home epitomizes the rejuvenated area's reputation as an ideal live-work-play urban environment.
